Guest: Leonardo Lobato, executive director at La Luz

La Luz is now in it's 40th years in Sonoma. Their mission is "to support Latino individuals and families in Sonoma Valley to attain their dreams and aspirations by providing access to knowledge, skill-building, and resources." They are being challenged

now in supporting the community and immigrants with the increase of negative political rhetoric that is spreading in our community and beyond. Many of our Sonoma community members are suffering and are afraid. Afraid to send their kids to school, to seek and receive medical care and even to go shopping. Sonoma is unique in that we are a unified and supportive community and we show compassion and love for all of our neighbors who work and live here. Although ICE has not been present in our community yet we are expecting it and are preparing as the country's leadership targets communities with immigrant populations. Please continue to show compassion for your neighbors regardless of your political views. These are people with families and children who need our support.

La Luz is open to everyone. They have doubled their efforts in all areas of services provided.

- 1. Direct Services Basic needs. We connect families and individuals to the most appropriate resources to address basic needs, such as housing, access to food and health care, emergency finances, and legal services.
- 2. Economic Advancement We provide four levels of English language classes throughout the school year for adults with proven textbooks and curriculum(current enrollment of 150). We offer small business support by means of guidance, training, workshops and loans/grants.
- 3. Family Services Early Childhood Education Hub provides parent-child education programs for children aged 0 to 3 years. This year-long program equips children with socio-emotional and cognitive skills and empowers parents to be their children's first and most important teachers. Parents gain the skills to engage and teach their children, along with leadership skills to advocate for their children's education once they enter school.
- 4. Immigration Support Support towards the path to naturalization and citizenship. One half of our undocumented citizens are actually eligible for naturalization. We help show them how to get there and let them know their rights. We offer a Family Preparedness Plan to help prepare for deportation of a family member.

How can we help?

Continue to encourage support of and love for our neighbors who may be suffering and afraid right now, not from a political stand but from a compassionate one. Guide them to La Luz for support. Continue to support local non-profits that are a great resource for La Luz and all members of the valley.
