Whitney has been a leader in awareness and support of those caring for loved ones with memory issues. SVIMA received a \$5000 donation two years ago to use for our group which we still have not done. Steve has reimbursed himself, upon approval from the group last year, for the annual fees for the website over the past 4 years (\$975) and we have used a bit for our annual luncheons. We currently have about \$4200 in our account. All agreed to reinstate the annual dues of \$25 which will be used for events or future luncheons.
